At this time, it is hoped that the main force of the storm will pass south of the Hawaiian Islands, except for the Big Island. However, we are still expected to experience powerful winds, heavy rains, and dangerous surf. Please make sure you make any necessary preparations today.

Tonight:


- Remove or secure any items outside your home.
- Trash and recycling collections have been cancelled for Friday, August 8. If Friday is your regular collection day, please hold your trash/recycling until next Friday. For more information about the trash service provided by the <u>City & County</u> of Honolulu.
- **Trash bins** must be placed in the trash bin enclosure (if your home has one), inside your garage, or against the side of your home. No bins may be left along the curb.
- Make sure your family is prepared in case the storm causes a power outage or water outage. Remember automatic garage door openers won't work if the power is out. Be sure to take a house key with you.
- Suggested list of emergency items from FEMA.

Tomorrow:

- Forest City's offices, Maintenance, and Self-Help Warehouse will be open regular hours. Please be aware that operations may be adjusted due to weather conditions. We appreciate your patience.
- No landscaping work will be done on Friday, August 8. Regularly scheduled work will resume on Saturday, weather permitting. Lawn care work originally scheduled for Friday, will be completed next Friday, weather permitting.

Other Useful Information:

- KSSK 92.3 FM and 590 AM are the official civil defense radio stations for Oahu. They have dedicated generators and stay on the air, even during island-wide power outages.
 - The State of Hawaii Civil Defense website has a listing of public shelters by island.
 - Note: Civil Defense and the Red Cross recommend sheltering in place unless you're in a flood zone, your home is structurally unsound, or you don't have friends or family you can shelter with. If you do choose to go to a shelter, you need to bring your own blankets, food, water and hygiene items, as shelter officials are only providing a safe place to ride out the storm.
 - For updated City and County of Honolulu shelter information visit their website.
 - o Kauai County will determine later whether to open shelters.
- On Oahu, The Bus and Handivan service has been suspended for Friday. Limited buses will run starting at 10 p.m. tonight only to serve as shuttles to official shelters.
